Crocodiles lays 10 to 60 eggs.

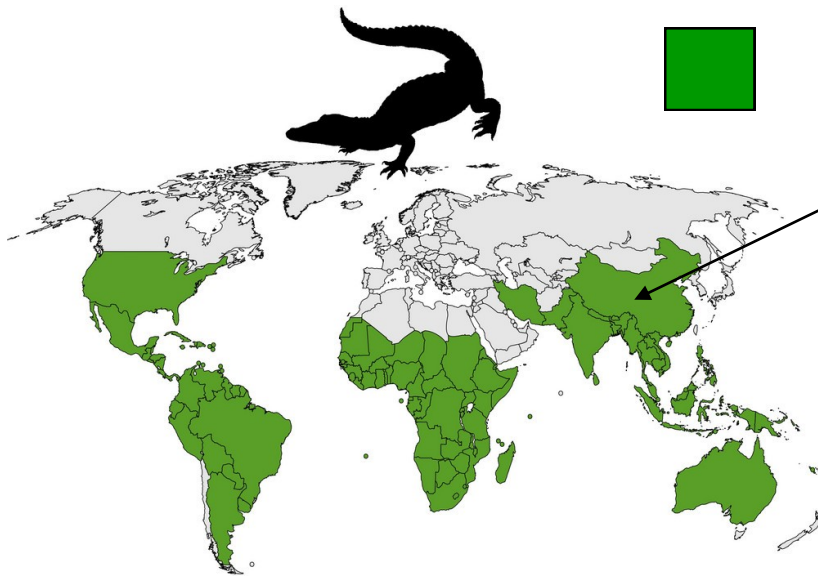
There are 2 different types of crocodiles, those that live in freshwater and those that live in saltwater.

Where do Crocodiles Live?

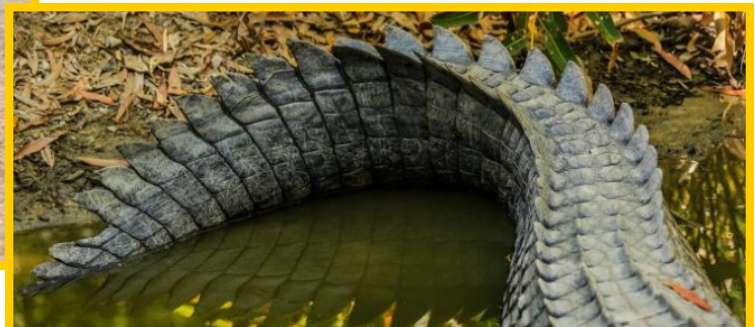


The green colour shows where crocodiles live.

Crocodiles live in so many different countries.

Crocodiles live in North America. They can also be found in the United States, most of South America, Mexico, Caribbean, Asia, Australia and Africa.

Crocodiles can be found in in the following areas: Grassland, Rainforest, Wetland, lakes, rivers, freshwater and saltwater.



What do Crocodiles Eat?

: Crocodiles are carnivores, which means they eat only meat. Crocodiles like to eat fish, frogs and birds.



Hibernation

Crocodiles create a place to hibernate. Crocodiles dig out a burrow in the side of river banks or lakes and settle in for a long sleep.



Life Span

Crocodiles can live from 70 to 100 years.

Length

Freshwater crocodiles can grow up to 2 to 3 meters long.

Saltwater crocodiles can grow up to 4 to 5 meters long.

Other crocodiles can grow up to 4 to 8 meters long.
